multiple words that make a new meaning with a verb

- get on
- take off
- look after

phrasal verb exampless

- 1. If you **get back** (to a place, situation or activity), you return to that place, situation or activity.
- 2. If a person depends on another person, the first person needs the support or help of the other person to exist or be OK.
- 3. When you **deal with** something or someone that needs attention, you give your attention to them, and you often solve a problem or make a decision concerning them
- 4. If you fill up a container or your car tank, it becomes full.
- 5. If you **fill in** a document or form, you write the necessary information in its spaces.

phrasal verb examples

- 6. If you **get along** with someone, you have a friendly relationship. You can also say that two people **get along**.
- 7. If you **find** something **out**, you learn or discover something you didn't know.
- 8. If you **cross out** words on a page, you draw a line through them, usually because they are wrong.
- 9. If you **end up** in a particular place or situation, it means that after a series of events, you unexpectedly find yourself in that place or situation.
